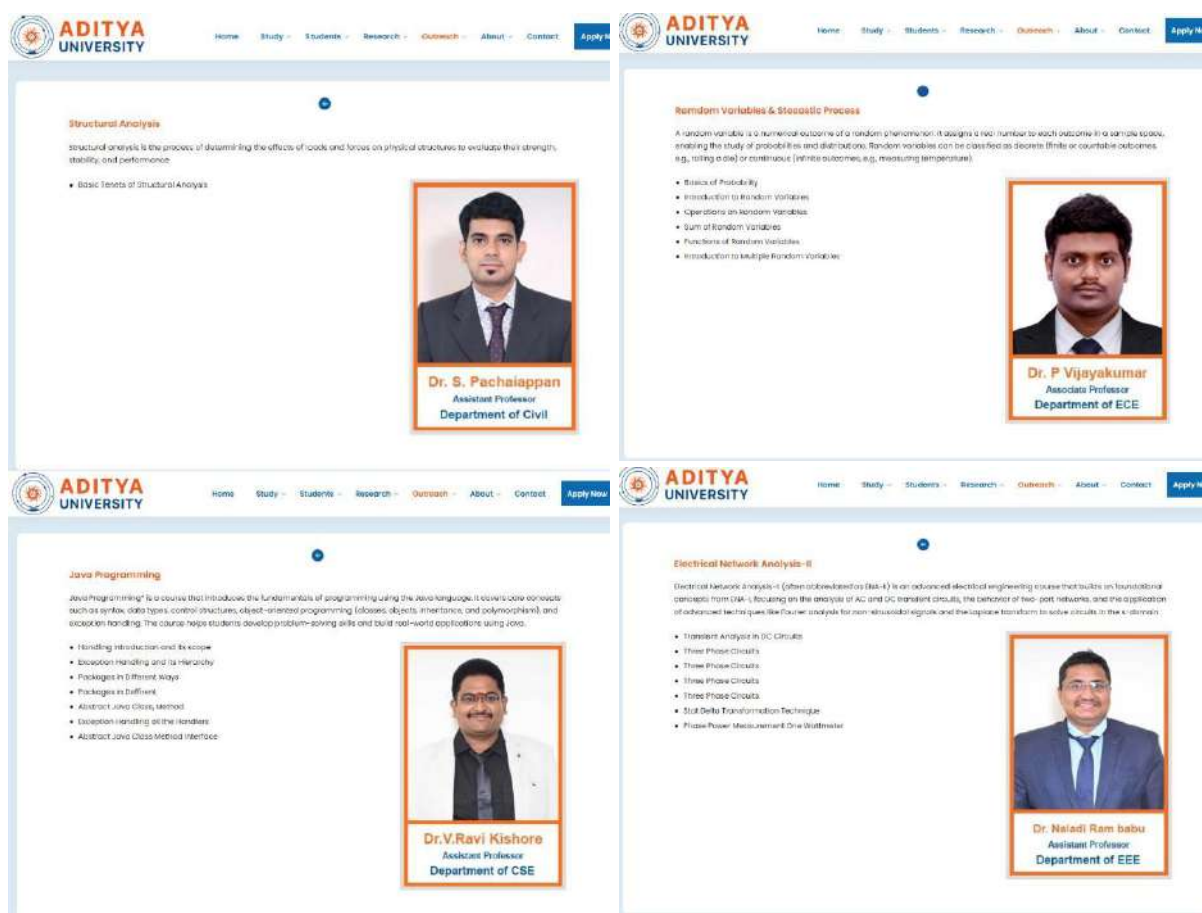


Fig. 1: Digital Learning Content (Open Access) accessed through university website

Events open to the general public

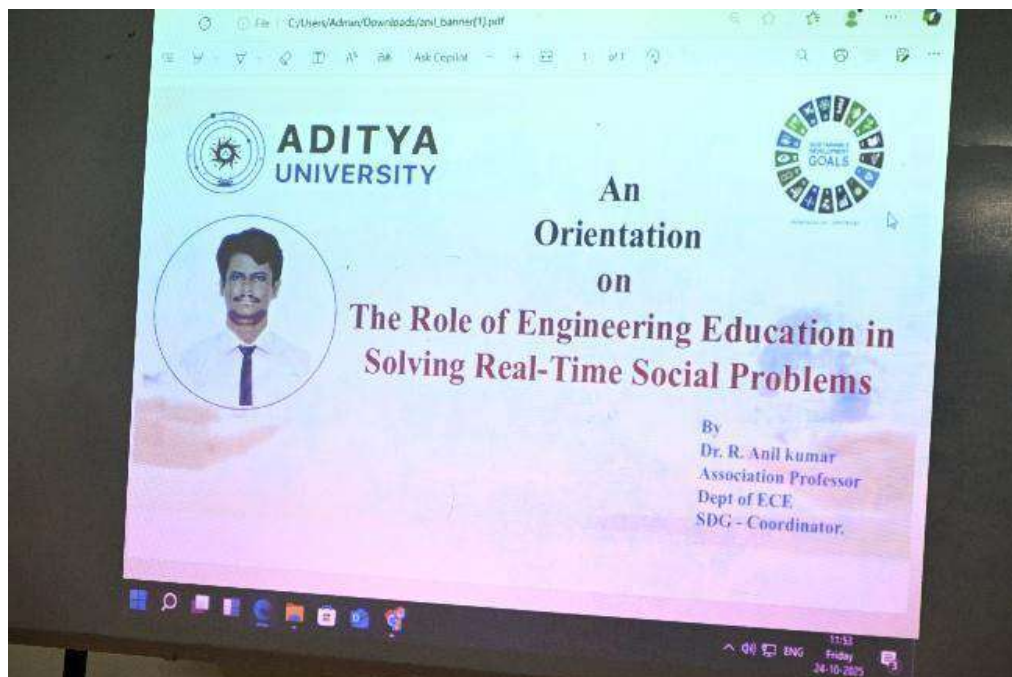




Fig.1: School students participating in various events

Executive educational and vocational training

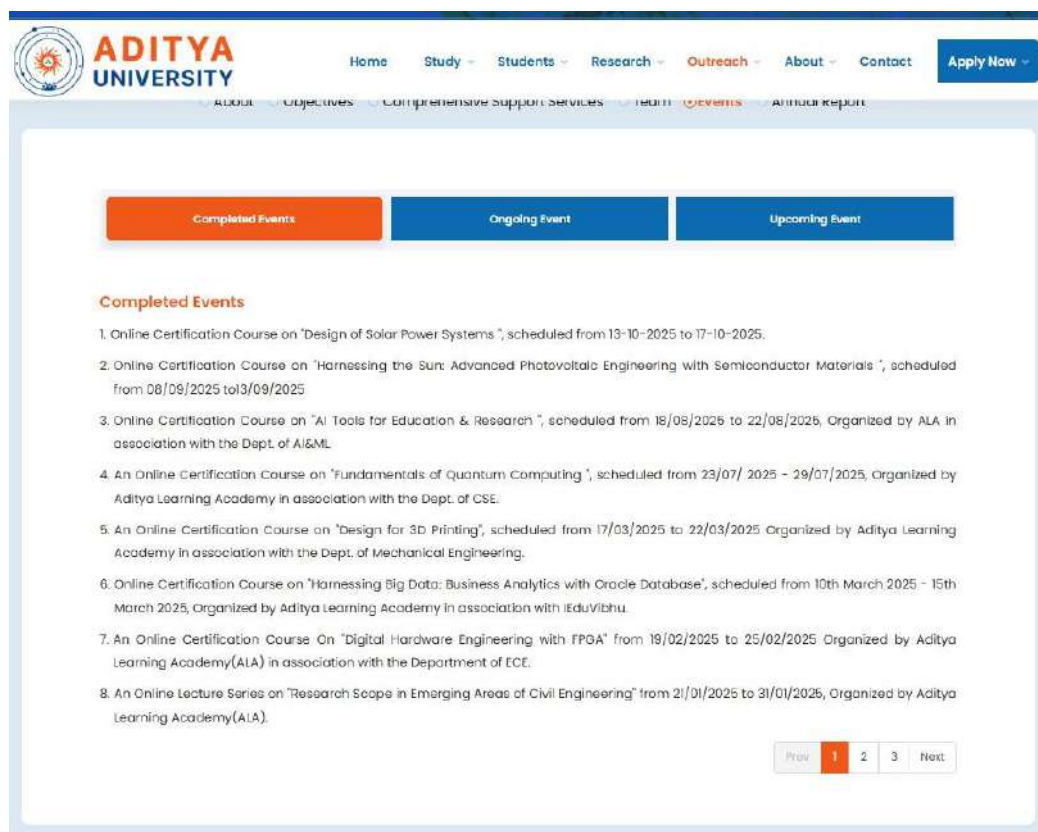


Fig. 1: University web page showing completed certification courses for the general public

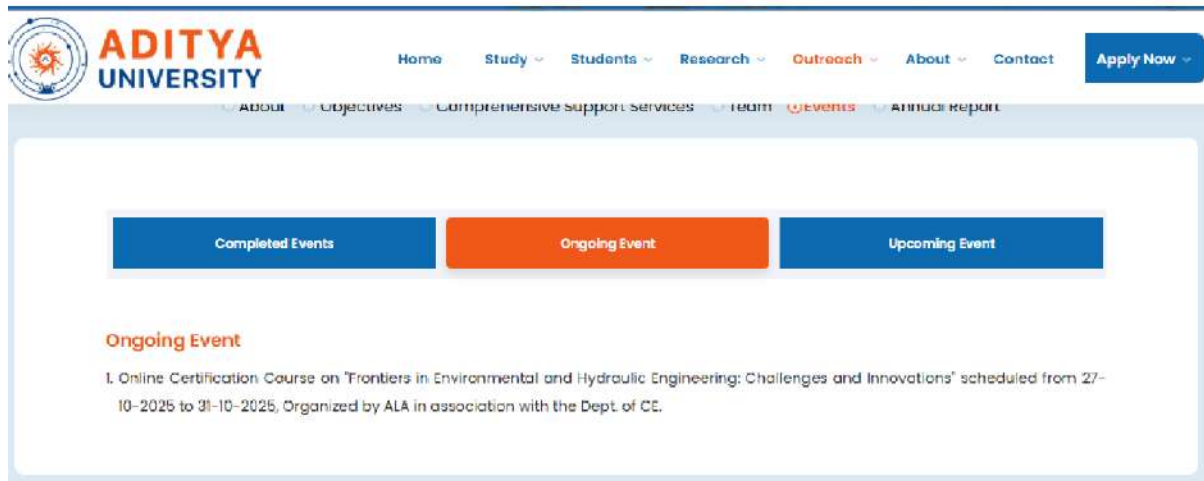


Fig. 2: University web page showing an ongoing course for the general public

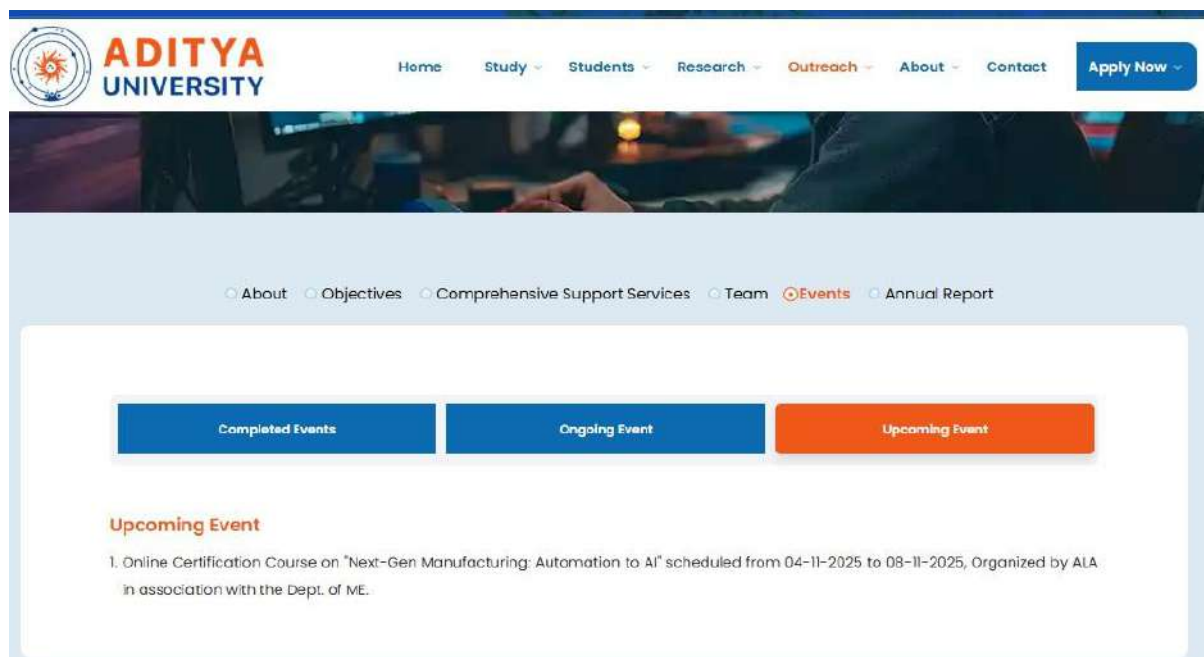


Fig. 3: University web page showing the upcoming courses for the general public

2. Certification and Evaluation

Each course concludes with an examination to assess the learner's understanding and engagement. Participants who successfully complete the course and evaluation process receive a formal certificate from the University, encouraging active and serious participation.

3. Flexible Learning for Working Professionals

The ALA programmes are structured to suit individuals who are employed or engaged in other commitments. These executive education courses provide an opportunity for participants to acquire new skills or upgrade existing ones during their free time, supporting continuous professional growth and development.
